TOPIC: Protecting Minnesota's Water and the BWCA from Sulfide Mining

PRESENTER: Steve Schultz, Government Relations Director, Friends of the Boundary Waters

This presentation will be an overview of Friends of the Boundary Waters work in Minnesota, the threat of copper nickel sulfide mining to clean water in Minnesota, how we are addressing those threats at the State and U.S. Capitols, and how people can get involved with our work.

As Government Relations Director, Steve brings more than 25 years of experience working in politics including lobbying at the capitol, volunteering for campaigns, and organizing people and communities to protect our water. When not at the capitol, or plotting with coworkers on how to win on our campaigns, he is probably in his garden or at the lake enjoying the outdoors on his kayak or sitting on the beach. Friends of the Boundary Waters: Protecting Clean Water and the Boundary Waters

Minnesota is the land of 10,000 Lakes; water is part of being a Minnesotan. However, there is a huge threat to clean water: copper-nickel sulfide mining. The Trump administration is moving quickly to clear the path for toxic copper-nickel sulfide mining near the Boundary Waters, Lake Superior, and the Mississippi and St. Croix Rivers. In the past year, a slew of executive orders, administrative attacks, and dangerous legislation threatened some of the cleanest water on the planet. But across the country millions of people stood up to these attacks. Our work in 2025 - lobbying legislators, educating the public, organizing supporters, and building a movement - stopped these attacks. But the fight is not over!

Friends of the Boundary Waters is working in our communities to educate and activate people who care about clean water and the BWCA. With you, we'll continue the fight for strong policies at the state and federal level.

Friends of the Boundary Waters' Clean Water Coalition and Citizen Action Network

The Clean Water Coalition (www.friends-bwca.org/cleanwater/) is a network of local businesses, indigenous-led organizations, faith-based groups, nonprofit organizations, and individuals, committed to strengthening legal protections for our waters and defending the safeguards already in place to stop threats to our clean water. This group meets on the third Thursday of the month at 1pm on Zoom.

Our Citizen Action Network (CAN) (www.friends-bwca.org/get-involved/prove-it-first/citizen-action-network/) is a group of dedicated supporters who meet twice a month on Wednesday evening, taking action to protect clean water and the Boundary Waters from toxic copper-nickel sulfide mining. From writing letters to the editor, calling electeds,

attending meetings, sharing on social media, there are so many ways to be involved. The CAN allows our supporters to put their love for clean water into action!

New Legislative Sessions, New Attacks

Preparation has begun for a new session of Congress and the state legislative session beginning on February 17, 2026. Our legislative agenda at the state level includes advocating for **Prove It First, the Bad Actor Bill, Taxpayer Protection Act**, and a **bill to permanently protect the BWCA watershed from toxic sulfide mining**. In anticipation of many attacks on clean water and wilderness this session in St. Paul and Washington D.C., we will ensure their protection by meeting with legislative leaders and activating our supporters.

- **Legislative Session Kickoff Events** in the Twin Cities and Duluth
As legislative session nears we will bring our supporters and legislators together to discuss our priorities for this legislative session to protect clean water and the BWCA:
 - Twin Cities: January 14, 2026, 6-8pm
 - Duluth: January 24, 2026, 4-6pm
- **Precinct Caucuses** (www.friends-bwca.org/blog/clean-water-delegate-2026/) on **Tuesday, February 3, 2026**. The caucuses are the official beginning of the 2026 elections. We will organize Democrats and Republicans to bring ideas to protect clean water to their Precinct Caucuses. Our team will provide language for resolutions and train people on what to expect at their precinct caucuses:
 - January 15, 2026 - Friends' "How to Caucus Training and Discussion Session"
 - January 28, 2026 - Friends' "Clean Water Delegate & Message Advocate Training"
- **Boundary Waters Day at the Capitol**
(www.friends-bwca.org/event/boundary-waters-day-at-the-capitol-2026/) on **Wednesday, February 25, 2026** from 9-3pm. Legislative leaders need to take a stand against foreign owned sulfide mining companies and protect clean water in Minnesota. We provide training and all the logistical support for our supporters so they can spend a day at the State Capitol learning about our policy priorities and how to lobby their elected officials. Supporters will meet with their legislators and rally for clean water in the Capitol Rotunda.
- **Sulfide Mining Hearing**
(www.friends-bwca.org/event/a-hearing-on-the-boundary-waters/) There has not been a legislative hearing on copper-nickel sulfide mining in over a decade. Last year we held our own public hearing. If we do not secure an official committee hearing this legislative session we will hold another like the one above to keep this issue in front of our elected officials, even if they don't want to talk about it! March date TBD.
- **Earth Day Rally at the State Capitol** - We'll bring together environmental organizations and concerned people working on many different issues to make sure we have clean air and water, and healthy communities.

Minnesota is the land of sky-blue waters, the land of 10,000 lakes. It's a place that is famous throughout the country for its lakes and rivers. But the water that makes the state so famous is under threat. Proposed copper-nickel sulfide mines, from the edge of the Boundary Waters to the headwaters of the Mississippi, put our water in danger. Friends will continue to fight to protect all our water in Minnesota from copper-nickel sulfide mining.

Columbia Declares Itself the First Nation in the Amazon with its Entire Forest Free of Oil and Mining Activities

A call for an '*Amazon alliance for life.*'

"...In a historic gesture announced at the 30th United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP30), Colombia became the first Amazonian nation to make its entire Amazon biome off-limits to oil and large-scale mining.."

"...The decision creates an unprecedented barrier to new mineral and oil extraction fronts, covering more than 48 million hectares—representing approximately 42% of Colombia's continental territory and 7% of the South American Amazon.."

"...During the session, Vélez Torres invited ACTO ministers to build an Amazon alliance for life, proposing coordinated efforts in biodiversity, climate, water, and strategies to fight environmental crime..."

"... protecting the Amazon does not hinder development: "The forest is one. The rivers have no borders, and neither does life. Caring for the Amazon is not an economic sacrifice—it's an ethical and scientific choice, a wager on the future of the region and of humanity..."

Pilot study: Minnesota's E-waste is Worth \$2.8 billion Each Year, but Most Isn't Captured

.."There's metals in our electronics. Really, really valuable, high-demand metals that are in our electronics that can be recycled and reused," said Jensen, an environmental health and safety coordinator at Repowered..."

"...The study used peer-reviewed research, reports and local data on e-waste to look at 62 different elements. ...The study found that the projected job creation — if 100% of e-waste in Minnesota were to be captured — is 1,738 direct jobs and a total of 3,345 new jobs..."

"These are jobs that they won't go away once the mine closes because the mine isn't going to close. Our electronics waste stream is growing every year," Jensen said.

Tamarack Water Alliance is a group of local residents and landowners working together with others from across Minnesota to protect water and community health from the dangers of sulfide mining near our beloved lakes and wild rice beds, at the headwaters of the Kettle River and in the Mississippi River watershed.
